Hamburger Soup

1 to 1 ½ lbs. ground beef

Chop desired amount of onion, celery, fresh garlic, cloves, yellow, red and green peppers. After browning burger, sauté vegetables with the burger. Set aside.

In 3 cups Beef broth, cook 4 diced carrots and 5 red potatoes. Season with salt, pepper, parsley, oregano, cayenne pepper and 3 tablespoons of tomato paste. Adjust seasonings and mix in burger mixture. You can add more broth if desired.

Arkansas Green Beans

INGREDIENTS:

5 (15 ounce) cans green beans, drained

½ C butter, melted

7 teaspoons soy sauce

7 slices bacon

1 ½ teaspoons garlic powder

2/3 C brown sugar

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place the drained beans in a 9 x 13 pan.
- 2. Cook bacon in microwave (you can cut up or leave whole) for 2 min. until slightly cooked. Lay bacon on green beans.
- 3. Combine the brown sugar, melted butter, soy sauce and garlic powder in small bowl. Pour mixture over beans and bacon. Bake uncovered in pre-heated oven for 40 minutes.

Serves 10 (can cut in half for 4-5)







MANAGEMENT INFORMATION

Happy March Everyone!

Just a few reminders from the Management Office:

It is the homeowner's responsibility to secure their home for summer storms or inclement weather. We are reminding residents all loose items need to be secured inside their sheds or home. These items include but are not limited to water hoses, chairs, tables, yard flags, recycling bins, trash bins and any other items that can blow away.



If you are a seasonal resident and are heading home for the summer, please come to the office and fill out an Out of Town / State form with your contact information so we can reach you in case of an emergency.

Homeowners (Titleholders) wanting to rent out their home must have the tenants (renters) fill out an application with the front office. I understand that many tenants/renters have been renting within the community for many years. We will still need a new application for renters/tenants every year. This does NOT mean homeowners (titleholders). Only if you are renting out your home. Applications are good for 60 days once someone leaves the property That means if your renter/tenant leaves the property for more then 60 days they will need to fill out an application for approval again.

Lot inspections have already started and will be wrapping up soon. Please make sure all items on the 360 Inspections Sheet you received have been completed by the date listed at the bottom of the sheet. Reinspection's will be done.

No Parking on the Street or Grass. If you do not have enough room in your driveway you will need to park at the clubhouse. Notices and/or violations will be sent if this issue is not corrected with this friendly reminder.

GATE ENTRY

Several residents, and some have been new residents, have indicated they could not get back into the park after the entry gate is down. In talking with them, they are not aware of the bar code sticker for the car or the 4-digit code that will open the gate.

Last spring Lakewood began issuing bar code stickers to be put in your car window. These stickers will be read by the newly installed reader at the kiosk as you drive by it. This will open the gate.

In addition, each resident was to determine a personal 4-digit code which could be used at the kiosk. After determining your code, it must be given to the office, so they can put it into their gate system. To open the gate with the code, enter the pound sign (#) followed by your code.

The remote openers used in the past can still be used but will not be replaced when they go bad.



ST. PATRICK'S DAY

NOTICE FROM THE LAKEWOOD OFFICE

The following information has been posted on bulletin board in the clubhouse since May 1, 2009. This is something that all residents should be aware of.

It was brought to our attention that residents were concerned with RV and Boats parked within the community more than 24 hours. As of this notice (May 1, 2009) all residents that have a motor home or boat will have only 24 hours to work, load or unload in front of their residence. Guests that have RV or Boats can check with the office to inquire if there is temporary space in

the compound. We will issue a key if space is available.

Renting

Residents that plan to rent their homes must notify the office first. If we are not notified by the home owners and the renters have not registered with their driver's license they will not be eligible to stay in the community.

Short term renting is a **three-month block.** If you are renting for only one or two months, you **cannot rent** again to another person until the three- month block has been used. Refer to your Rules and Regulations.

LAKEWOOD'S NEW "PLAYGROUND"

Last summer construction began to renovate the swimming pool and the area surrounding the pool. The first part of the renovation was to redo the pool along with the decking around the pool. The pool was resurfaced, and new pavers were installed for the pool deck.

Next was relocating the shuffleboard courts, bocce ball court and putting green. Four shuffleboard courts



were built, and two bocce ball courts have been installed This has been done but not yet completed and usable. Paving bricks

were installed around some of this area and landscaping installed in other sections of the area.

A large patio area was installed just outside the pool fence at one end of the pool. Included in this area was a fire pit and a cooking grill. Pavers were installed in this area.

All this work is looking very nice but not sure if the seasonal residents will see the completion, or get to use any of it, before leaving for the summer. Work seems to be going at a slow pace. But they will have something to look forward to when they return next fall.



DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

Daylight saving time in the United States is the

practice of setting the clock forward by one hour during the warmer part of the year, so that evenings have more daylight and mornings have less. Most areas of the United States observe daylight saving



time (DST), the exceptions being Arizona, Hawaii and the overseas territories of American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, and the United States Virgin Islands.

In general, daylight saving time is not observed in lower-latitude regions, as summer days are not much longer than winter ones as in higher latitudes.

Daylight saving time starts on the second Sunday in March and ends on the first Sunday in November, with the time changes taking place at 2:00a.m. local time. With a mnemonic word play referring to seasons, clocks "spring forward, fall back" —that is, in springtime the clocks are moved forward from 2:00a.m. to 3:00a.m. and in fall they are moved back from 2:00a.m. to 1:00a.m. Daylight saving time lasts for a total of 34 weeks (238 days) every year, about 65% of the entire year.

In 2018, daylight saving begins on Sunday, March 11 and ends on Sunday, November 4 at 2:00am each date.

Getting Old


I've sure gotten old.
