Motion by Bob Green to approach Murex Management Company regarding paying the repair bill on the sound system in the amount of \$300 if they take over the system. Supported by Anne Lennon. Motion defeated 5 to 3.

Motion by Bob Green to recommend to the membership the removal of the \$5,000 for renovation obligation that was approved at the March 28, 2017 association meeting. Supported by Judy Oliver. Motion passed by unanimous vote.

Discussion regarding HOA property insurance coverage will be readdressed at the next board meeting. Current premium is approximately \$600.

Board will have a special meeting regarding review of the current bylaws after the election at the January association meeting.

Ladies of the board will be hosting the March ladies luncheon/style show.

Lobster/Steak dinner will be on Thursday March 7, 2019. Dinner will be free to all HOA members paying their dues on or before February 15, 2019. Only paid HOA members may attend.


LINE DANCING


