Motion by Bob Green to have a special funding set up for the monthly potluck committee to use, if requested, for extras they deem necessary for hosting the potluck. Judy Oliver supported. Motion failed with a 1 yes and 7 no vote.

Motion by Ruth Brooks to provide funding for HOLIDAY POTLUCKS ONLY in an amount not to exceed \$100 for any extras that are deemed necessary. Cheryl Wellence supported. Vote unanimous.

Motion by Bob Green that we allocate up to \$75 for the Easter potluck. Judy Oliver supported. Vote unanimous.

Motion by Bob Green to roll over the current CD that is due March 28, 2018 in the amount of \$10,000. Chris Bennett supported. Vote unanimous.

Motion by Judy Oliver to appoint Joe Glasgow to the HOA board to fill the vacancy created by Cheryl Staicoff. Bob Green supported. Motion supported with 5 yes and 3 no. Joe had the next highest vote count at the January election of directors.

STORAGE LOT



In April's issue of the newsletter, we ask residents who are using the storage lot to be sure the chain is snugged up tight before putting the padlock on it. This will prevent the gate from being pushed open

enough to allow unauthorized persons into the lot. These unauthorized persons are probably ones that want to steal or vandalize your stored items. I do not think any of you want to see that happen to your units.

This request does not seem too complicated or too much to ask. However, after the newsletter article the gate has been checked and the padlock was found again to be put in the last links of the chain allowing the gate to be pushed open enough for a person to gain access to the lot.

SUGGESTIONS FOR SEASONAL CLOSING OF YOUR HOME

Contact office if you want your water turned off at curb. Be sure and allow a few days when you request to have it turned back on. If you do not have it shut off at curb, be sure and shut off water on outside of home. Also, turn off water heater and shut offs on sinks and toilets.

Shut off breakers for water heater, dryer and refrigerator. If you want to leave refrigerator plugged in, put on warmest settings unless you leave food in the refrigerator. You can put sugar, flour, spices, boxed food in there for storage. It is good to put a baggie of ice cubes in freezer, if melted, you will know that electricity was off for a period and you should dispose of items in freezer.

Crack open all cupboards, drawers and closets.

Trip GFI switch in guest bathroom (press black button and red button should pop out. This will shut off electricity on outside outlets.

Dishwasher, pour 1 gal water in tub.

Garbage disposal, clean out and run, then pour ¼ cup Mazola oil and put in stopper.

Thermostat: change batteries and set Air Conditioner to desired temp. If you use a humidistat, follow recommended settings.

Put Saran wrap over toilet, tank and drains to prevent evaporation.

Sinks - put plugs down.

Close blinds.

Put all outdoor furniture, grill and garbage cans in shed or home. Move planters to a neighbor or make arrangements that someone will put them in your shed in case of hurricane. Put away all outside yard decorations and garden hose. Make sure nothing is left outside that could be blown around and cause damage to your or your neighbor's home.

Put on Hurricane Shutters if you have them.
