

Friday November 8th, 2024 10:15 a.m.

Meeting was called to order at 10:27 a.m.

A Quorum was reached.

Reports:

1. President's report by JoAnn Donovan.

The job descriptions for all Committee members have been completed and will be distributed to the Board via email. Input is to be returned to JoAnn by Dec. 1st, 2024.

Bob Janovic and JoAnn Donovan met with the park manager Mike Albaugh. It has been determined that the sound system is owned by Murex and Mike will bring in a new sound system-person to work on the issue with the noise in the sound system. The Hot Tub is waiting for maintenance to come out and check the problem with the new part that was purchased. J2W will be looking at the fence and they will repair it starting next week. The Gates are fixed. There is a second camera person coming to repair or replace the cameras. They will be looking into adding more cameras to cover more areas. JoAnn Donovan will find out from Mike which camera records. The lights around the park have been out since the flood because the photo sensors were damaged. Mike is getting a new electrician because the former one has had some health issues. The Clubhouse lights on the porch will also be looked at. The new grill area will be tested out today for Hamburger Night.

2. Treasurer's report by Ruth Brooks. Total assets as of October 31, 2024, are \$26,867. Our October expenses were \$735, Income was \$676, bringing us in at a loss of \$59 for the month. Our year-to-

- date profit is \$1,725.
- A detailed report is posted on the bulletin board in the clubhouse. The Bank of Ozarks CD's have been reinstated to a higher bearing CD and we should see greater gains over the coming months. Arrangements are in place for securing Sinkunas & Company as our CPA.
- 3. Secretary's report by Linda Anderson. There is no new correspondence. The minutes were sent out to all Board Members. Pam Hench made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Bob Janovic, the motion passed.

Committee Reports

- 1. Social Committee by Pam Hench. There will be a Veterans Day presentation at 1:00 on Monday 11/11/24. The Social Committee had its first Book Club meeting which was very successful. There will be Trivia nights beginning soon. Thanksgiving Potluck is coming along well.
- 2. Building Committee by Bill Ganier. In collaboration with the Social Committee there is an end of summer hamburger night planned with over 80 people signed up. The Honor flight is scheduled for Nov. 13th 9-9:30 pm.
- 3. By-Laws Committee by Maureen Schutte. A Committee Chairperson is still needed at this time.
- 4. FMO by Bob Janovic. On November 19th there will be a Zoom meeting. This meeting is geared for those interested in becoming a Park Representative.
- 5. Safety Committee by Tom Anderson. There are no new break-ins to report in our area. Not many calls in our area. A full report that is emailed from Officer Batson to Tom Anderson will now be forwarded to JoAnn Donovan and Leo Wellence so he can put it in the newsletter.
- 6. Communications Committee by Monica Richardson. Nothing new to report.

Unfinished Business:

- 1. We are still in need of a Chairperson for the By-Laws Committee.
- 2. Pam Hench is working on ordering parts for the sandwich board.

New Business:

1. The November HOA meeting will be on Tuesday November 19th at 7 p.m., therefore as is listed

- in the by-laws, Bingo will be held on Monday November 18th at 7 p.m.
- 2. Nominees are being recruited for the Election by Susan Janovic. Dave Drullinger will run again, Linda Anderson will run again, Maureen Schutte is undecided, Angie Fotis will not run again, Pam Hench will not run again, Joan White will run if she is needed, and Ruth is undecided. Sandra Lucht will run for office.
- 3. The Homeowners Committee (aka The Rent Committee) met with Murex Management on Friday, Nov. 1, 2024. Present for the Zoom meeting were committee members Monica Richardson, Pamela Hench, Ray Fotis and Ruth Brooks. Murex was represented by Steven Adler, President, Eric Zimmerman, CEO, and Mike Albaugh, Park Manager. The meeting opened with a presentation by Murex explaining rent increase and tax pass-on.
- **FYI:** Committee visited 3 land-leased parks within a 10-mile radius and concluded that Lakewood Village rent is within the average rent.

Positive outcomes:

Allocation of financial support - \$1,200 per year.

- Bocce Ball court to be addressed with Park Manager
- Murex looking into better chairs for clubhouse
- Capital Expenditure-residents to voice ideas, final decision up to Murex
- 2025 Capital Expenditure-outdoor covered seating and outdoor kitchen
- Speaker system belongs to Murex, Park Manager is to address
- Mulch to be distributed on common space.
- Some of the other issues discussed were left unresolved but seeds were planted. One big topic was addressing additional Golf Cart Parking and Murex explained that being in a flood zone the possibility of laying more concrete was unlikely and zone prohibited.

Adjournment:

Bob Janovic made a motion to adjourn at 11:58, seconded by Joan White, the motion passed.

The next BOD meeting will be on Friday Dec. 13th at 10:15.



THE MONTH OF DECEMBER:

How many holidays are in December? More than you might imagine! Learn about feasts, festivals of lights, and shooting stars! Also, find out why December is no longer the 10th month of the year.

December is the 12th month (and last month) in our modern-day Gregorian calendar (as it was in the preceding Julian calendar).

However, it was initially the 10th month of the Roman calendar (until 153 BC). Hence, "December" comes from the Latin decem, meaning "ten."

In Roman times, the calendar only had ten months and began with March! The winter period was not even assigned months because it was not an active time for military, agriculture, or civil life.

The month of December originally consisted of 30 days. After January and February were added to the calendar (around 700 BCE), December was shortened to 29 days. Then, two days were added to December in the subsequent Julian calendar, making it 31 days long.

December Calendar:

- **December 1** is the First Sunday of Advent, marking the beginning of the Advent season.
- **December 6** is Saint Nicholas Day. The patron saint of children is the model for Santa Claus and giftgiving.
- **December 7** is National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.
- **December 8** is Bodhi Day in the Buddhist calendar, celebrating Buddha's enlightenment; it's celebrated in a way that's similar to how Christians celebrate Christmas to honor Jesus Christ.
- December 13 is St. Lucia's Day, which has long been associated with festivals of light. Before the Gregorian calendar reform in 1752, her feast day occurred on the shortest day of the year (hence the saying "Lucy light, Lucy light, shortest day and longest night").
- **December 15** is Bill of Rights Day.
- December 17 is Wright Brothers Day.

- **December 21** is the Winter Solstice—the astronomical day when the Earth is farthest away from the Sun. Starting in ancient times, people celebrated the rebirth of the Sun event through Yule.
- **December 25** is Christmas Day, a Christian holiday commemorating the birth of Jesus Christ. Learn more about American Christmas traditions.
- **December 25** also marks the beginning of Hanukkah this year, the eight-day Jewish festival of lights.
- **December 26** is Boxing Day (Canada, UK) and the first day of Kwanzaa.
- On the last evening of the year, **December 31**, kiss the person you hope to keep kissing! Discover New Years traditions from around the world.

Full Cold Moon

December's full Moon, the Full **Cold Moon**, appears on Friday, December 15, reaching peak illumination at 4:02 A.M. EST.


