

President's Report - Nothing to report. Secretary's Report - by Linda Anderson.

There is a correction to the Board of Directors Transition Meeting minutes: Dave Drullinger was put in as Chairman of the By-Laws committee when it should have read that he is a member.

Ruth Brooks made a motion to accept the Secretary's report as written and was seconded by Sandy Lucht, all were in favor, and the motion passed.

Linda Anderson asked if having the community yard sale in 2 weeks next year would cause any issues financially for the HOA and was told it would not be a problem.

Committee Reports:

Rent Committee - by Ruth Brooks

The Homeowners Committee (aka Rent Committee) brought a draft letter to be sent to Murex stating residents' concerns to the Board for discussion. A motion was made by Ruth to not go any further with this until we can discuss the items on the list with Murex officials. Linda Anderson seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

FMO Committee - by Bob Janovic

We are organizing when the new members will take the 723-training available March 15th 1-4 pm, April 14th 10-1 am, and May 20th 1-4 pm.

Safety Committee - by Tom Anderson

Officer Batson was here on Thursday Feb 6th at 11 am and reported on all the police happenings in the area. He also said that he does drive through here more often than other communities. We need to remind the residents that a flashlight is needed when

it is dark when walking in the community. This should be added in this month's newsletter.

Website Committee - by Lisa Schutte

It was suggested that we change our website host since the one we are using now is old and not likely to stay in business much longer. Lisa has found 2 other Hosts that look better equipped. She suggested that we use Weebly, which would cost a few dollars more a month. A lot more information could be added to the website as well as pictures of events. It is more Mobile phone friendly, and we can add password protection as well with the new Host. Dianne Peake-Mushall made a motion to go ahead and obtain the new Host, Linda Anderson Seconded. After discussion of the board Ruth Brooks made an addendum to the motion to do an annual payment instead of Monthly with this new website. All were in favor, the motion passed.

Lisa Schutte also noted the Guest wi-fi in the Clubhouse has been unreliable to do zoom meetings and the other wi-fi has proven to be more reliable.

Building Committee - by Bill Ganier

Bill spoke about how many of the lights have been damaged from the hurricanes and flooding. He said we really need to restock lights and other items used to decorate for all the different holidays. He was looking for suggestions as to how to get more money for the items he needs to replace. It was noted that we have started putting out a bucket for donations at the activities we have. One activity the money goes to the Social Committee and the next time it goes to the Building Committee. It was suggested that we have a Spaghetti dinner for all residents of the park, with the HOA paying the expenses and the entry money going to the Building Committee. It was also suggested that Bill put out a bucket for donations on Friday and let everyone know the amount collected each week just like we do with St. Vincents. A motion was made by Ruth Brooks that Bill be allowed to purchase items monthly, or as he finds them on sale, but not exceed the yearly budget line-item amount. Dianne Peake-Mushall seconded, all in favor and the motion carried.

Old Business:

The question was asked at the last board meeting if our liability insurance would cover personal injury or property damage caused by fireworks. Our policy would not cover this; however, we can secure a "one day policy" for this coverage for less than \$100 and can be applied for 10 days before the event. Dave Drullinger made a motion that we purchase this

insurance prior to any firework displays. It was seconded by Dianne Peake-Mushall. All were in favor and the motion passed.

New Business:

Ruth Brooks said that she is looking into a better speaker system for the zoom meetings. The cost would be around \$100, and the quality of the sound would be greatly improved. Maureen Schutte made a motion that Ruth purchase the speakers for less than \$200. Dianne Peake-Mushall seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Adjournment

Dianne Peake-Mushall made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 11:30 and it was seconded by Linda Anderson. All were in favor, and the motion carried.

THE MONTH OF MARCH:

"March" is named for the Roman god of war, Mars. This was the time of year to resume military campaigns that had been interrupted by winter.

In the early Roman calendar, March (or Martius) was the first month of the calendar year. As March brought the first day of spring with the vernal equinox, it was the start of new beginnings.

March became the third month when January and February, which were added to the end of the Roman calendar around 700 BCE, instead became the first and second months around 450 BCE.

March Calendar:

- March 4 is Mardi Gras (aka "Fat Tuesday" or Shrove Tuesday), which is the final feasting day before the Christian tradition of Lent begins on the following day, Ash Wednesday.
- March 5 is Ash Wednesday, which marks the start of Lent.
- March 8 is International Women's Day, which is a day that not only celebrates the achievements of women and the progress made toward women's rights but also brings attention to ongoing struggles for equality around the world.
- March 9 is the start of <u>Daylight Saving Time</u>, which begins at 2:00 A.M. that day. If your area observes it, don't forget to "spring forward" and set the clocks one hour ahead, or you may find yourself an hour late to everything!
- March 15 is the <u>Ides of March</u>! Legend surrounds this ill-fated day. Beware the Ides of March!
- March 17 is <u>St. Patrick's Day</u>. According to folklore, folks wear a shamrock on St. Patrick's Day because the saint used its three leaves to explain the Trinity.
- March 20 brings about the March equinox—also called the vernal or spring equinox in the Northern Hemisphere—marking the beginning of spring. In the Southern Hemisphere, this date marks the autumnal equinox and the beginning of fall. On this day, the Sun stands directly over Earth's equator.
- March 29-31 are known as the <u>Borrowing Days</u>. According to lore, the last three days of March have a reputation for being stormy.




