Liaison Committee by Pam Hench read by JoAnn Donovan

Pam's email: Submitted details of the patio suggestion in March. No feedback to share with residents at this point. 

If you see vendors driving very fast, please jot down the business name and let the office know. If there are any emergencies or suspicious activity call 911.




