

If you have purchased something that was registered in someone else's name, you will need to change the registration to your name. We will be putting up a sign up so that the Sheriff will have an idea how many need this service. Please do not wait till it's close to the end time as the Sheriff's Department has other places they have to go to that day. Our time is 9-11. Any-one in line will be taken care of but try to be punctual.

Sheriff Batson has a meeting every month in the clubhouse on the first Thursday of the



month at 11:00. Please join us. Lots of valuable info is given out. Please remember to use a flashlight when walking or biking after dark. Locking your car is a must to keep your car and valuables safe. The speed limit is 15 mph on your cart or in your car. The office will be sending out letters to those in violation.

Everyone is encouraged to keep an eye out for your neighbors and report anything suspicious to the Police. Month of February

February is the only month to have a length of fewer than 30 days! Though it's usually 28 days, February is 29 days long in <u>leap years</u> such as 2020 and 2024.

January and February were the last two months to be added to the Roman calendar (c. 713 BC); originally, winter was considered a month-less period.

Originally, February was made the last month of the calendar year. Eventually (c. 450 BC), February was moved to its place as the second month.

# February Calendar:

**February 2** is Groundhog Day—the day we find out whether winter will last six more weeks or call it quits early. How did this quirky tradition get started? Find out the meaning of Groundhog Day.

**February 10** is the <u>Lunar New Year</u>. Celebrated widely throughout East Asia, this holiday begins with the first new Moon after the Winter Solstice and is associated with the Chinese Zodiac.

**February 12** is <u>Abraham Lincoln's Birthday</u>. The 16th president of the United States was born in a one-

room, 16x18-foot log cabin with a dirt floor.

**February 13** is <u>Mardi Gras</u> (aka "Fat Tuesday" or Shrove Tuesday), which is the final feasting day before the Christian tradition of Lent begins on the following day, Ash Wednesday.

**February 14** is <u>Ash Wednesday</u>, which marks the start of Lent.

**February 14** is always Valentine's Day. Heads up, lovebirds! Today, the holiday is celebrated with love, flowers, and chocolate, but how did this holiday get its start? <u>Learn all about Valentine's Day</u>.

**February 15** is <u>Susan B. Anthony's Birthday</u>. How much do you know about this women's right leader?

February 15 is also National Flag of Canada Day! February 19 brings Presidents' Day, a federal holiday also known as Washington's Birthday that is celebrated on the third Monday in February. (George Washington's actual birthday is February 22!)

**February 29** is Leap Day! Happening once every four years, we are given an extra day in February. Some think this day brings good luck.

# **Ingredients:**

For the fries:

2 tablespoons butter

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

1 cup milk

1 1/2 cups cheddar cheese, shredded.

salt, to taste

pepper, to taste

# **Toppings:**

1/2-pound bacon, cooked, crumbled

1/4 cup sour cream

4 green onions, chopped.

### **Directions:**

Step 1 -Bake the French fries according to the package directions.

Step 2 -In a small saucepan, melt the butter.

Step 3 -Whisk the flour into the butter and cook, while whisking, until the raw flour all disappears, about 1 minute.

Step 4 -Slowly add the milk to the flour mixture and cook, while stirring until the mixture thickens slightly, about 5 minutes.

Step 5 -Transfer the sauce from the heat and stir the cheese in until completely melted and thoroughly combined.

Step 6 -Season the sauce with salt and pepper.

Step 7 -Immediately drizzle the baked fries with the cheese sauce.

Step 8 -Sprinkle the fries with the bacon and drizzle with the sour cream.

Step 9 -Sprinkle the fries with the green onions. Step 10 -Serve.

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


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
