

Treasurer's Report - Ronda Good -Board accepted and to be filed for audit.

Committee Reports

Social Committee – Letter from Patti Thomas was read regarding her resignation as Chairperson. Cheryl Wellence was asked to find a replacement and we were informed that Linda Anderson and Cheryl Pace are replacing Patti. Linda Anderson gave the Board a report of what they have planned so far. Pam Hench, Lainey Hostetler, & Alaina Lewis have volunteered to be on the committee.

Building Committee – Bill Ganier reported that a sausage meal is being done this month and they are going to be putting up flags. Plans are to not have burgers every month, which will give the residents more of a variety. He also reminded us that the money from this helps support lights that decorate the park.

By-Laws Committee – David Rohner reported that they met on April 19th. He presented a handout with the suggested changes they feel need to be made from the Rules and Regulations section. The Board said they would table this and asked that they bring it to the next meeting. The committee also suggested that Lakewood Village HOA have an FMO representative.

Communication – Cheryl Schrack - No one present Liaison Committee – Dick Langston said they presented a proposal to Mike about the fencing around the park. He also announced that a suggestion box was put up where the mailboxes are and that an announcement needs to be put in the newsletter again explaining it.

Safety Committee – John Pernice We were informed by Tom Anderson that the Sheriff's dept. will supply signs and vests for the people who do the park patrol.

Discussion followed regarding the cost and purchase of hats for the patrols and the purchase of another light for the golf carts. The Board voted to go ahead with this.

Ad Hoc Committee – Monic Richardson report on the work of the Hurricane Preparedness Committee's progress. They met May 1st and are working on making a one sheet document that can be given to everyone when finished. The document would show what the expectations of Management, Residents, and HOA would be. Their next meeting is May 16th.

Unfinished Business / General Order –The key code to the storage room was changed. It was decided that there should be a list of code holders posted on the bulletin board along with their phone numbers so that people can call and ask to be let in. Joann Donovan has a list started and will post it on the bulletin board.

Neighborhood Watch request for some equipment – Tom Anderson researched the cost of the following: Signage-\$160 per canvas to put on front of golf carts. Hats are \$100 for 5 hats and \$25.00 for the embroidery fee. They offer T-Shirts at \$5.00 each. Emergency flashers on top of golf carts are \$50 to \$100 each. Ruth asked for a motion for hats and lights to be purchased.

Tom Anderson made a motion to purchase five hats with a second from Ronda - motion passed. Emergency lights - Motion was made by Tom Anderson to buy another light at \$40. plus tax with a second by Cheryl Wellence. Motion passed. Tom will oversee the purchase of the hats and light.

Fencing - It was noted that lots 126 to 141 have no fence behind their houses. Mike was given this information and he is to take it to Murex.

Bingo Machine – Cheryl Wellence reported on the cost of a new Bingo Machine and that the lowest price she found was \$3,000.00. Therefore, this must be presented to the membership at the November meeting since the cost is over \$1,000.00.

New Business - It was announced that due to Patti Thomas' resignation, Linda Anderson is the new chair for the Social Committee. She is asking the HOA for a deposit of \$949.50 to schedule a January Murder Mystery event at the clubhouse. A motion was made to advance the Social Committee the money for the deposit that they will repay. No discussion – Dick called the Question – Approval given with a show of hands.

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AIR FRYER LEMON DONUTS

Prep Time: 20 mins Cook Time: 12 mins. Total Time: 32 mins

This is such an easy recipe for the entire family, and sure to be a family favorite, with a great taste of lemon, this is the



perfect breakfast, snack, or dessert.

Author: Fork to Spoon

Ingredients

Donuts:

1 3/4 cup all-purpose flour

1/4 cup cornstarch

3/4 cup granulated sugar

2 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon salt

3/4 cup buttermilk

2 large eggs

2 tablespoons butter unsalted and melted.

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

2 teaspoons lemon zest

Glaze:

1/2 cup granulated sugar

4 teaspoons lemon zest grated.

4-5 tablespoons butter unsalted and melted.

Instructions:

In a large bowl, mix the flour, cornstarch, sugar, bak-ing powder, salt, buttermilk, eggs, butter, lemon juice, vanilla extract, and lemon zest.

Mix well until it's well blended. Mix until smooth. Then spray your donut pans with non-stick cooking spray and pour the batter in 3/4 way full.

Set them into the air fryer for 10-12 minutes at 320 degrees F, air fryer setting.

Make the icing mix by blending the sugar, lemon zest, and melted butter. Drizzle over the donuts.

Plate, serve, and enjoy!





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
